Between 1870 and 1890, the artist <u>Odilon Redon</u> created mostly black and grey compositions, which he named his "noirs." He explored the strange, sublime, and fantastical. They were also inspired by literary works, including those of Edgar Allen Poe and Charles Baudelaire. In 1882, Redon published a series of works titled "To Edgar Allan Poe" that depict imaginative visual worlds seemingly lifted from Poe's mysterious prose.







Carrington was intrigued by the art of alchemy and explored its powers throughout her art. In *The Necromancer*, Carrington brings together a variety of symbolic objects, such as the pyramid and the eggs. The Necromancer itself is draped in a white gown and points towards the 'philosophical egg' or alembic, the ellipsoidal vessel where the distillation process takes place. The mouth of our genderless conjuror is open, as if singing or chanting and on its arm is its familiar, with its black tail looped round for safety.









Different Worlds showcases Sherpa's masterful technique, intricate attention to detail, and remarkable ability to blend diverse artistic influences. His compositions of deities, archetypal figures, and mythological narratives bridge the gap between Eastern and Western aesthetics, inviting viewers to witness the interplay of tradition and modernity. Through vivid portraiture and richly layered symbolism, he invites viewers to contemplate the universal aspects of existence while celebrating the uniqueness of cultural diversity.



MI $r\bar{a}J$, is the legend of the ascension of Prophet Muhammad into heaven, generally celebrated on the 27th day of Rajab, *Laylat al-MI* $r\bar{a}J$ (*"Night of the Ascension"*), although there is no unanimous opinion on the precise date The legend states that the Prophet was taken from Mecca to Jerusalem by Angel Gabriel on a winged, white horse, Buraq, from where he ascends through the seven heavens and is greeted by, and in effect validated by the previous Prophets (Adam, Joseph, Aaron, Moses, Abraham, and Jesus).


