Physical paintings representative of existing Non-Fungible Tokens (NFTs) hang in the Asian Art Museum during a press preview event for Takashi Murakami's upcoming exhibit.



GUERRILLA GIRLS' CODE OF ETHICS FOR ART MUSEUMS.

- Thou shalt not be a Museum Trustee and also the Chief Stockholder of a Major Auction House.
- Dealer, with whom he/she has had a sexual relationship, unless such liaison is explicitly stated on a wall label 8" from the exhibited work.
- Thou shalt not give more than 3 retrospectives to an Artist whose Dealer is the brother of the Chief Curator.
- IV. Thou shalt not limit thy Board of Trustees to Corporate Officers, Wealthy Entrepreneurs and Social Hangers-on. At least .001% must be Artists representing the racial and gender percentages of the U.S. population.
 - Ve Thou shalt not permit Corporations to launder their public images in Museums until they cleaneth up their Toxic Waste Dumps and Oil Slicks.

- Thou shalt provide lavish funerals for Women and Artists of Color who thou planeth to exhibit only after their death
- Will f thou art an Art Collector sitting on the Acquisitions or Exhibitions Committee, thou shalt useth thy influence to enhance the value of thine own collection not more than once a year.
- VIII. Thy Corporate Benefactors who earneth their income from products for Women and People of Color shalt earmark their Museum donations for exhibits and acquisitions of art by those groups.
 - Thou shalt keepeth Curatorial Salaries so low that Curators must be Independently Wealthy, or willing to engage in Insider Trading.
 - X. Thou shalt admit to the Public that words such as genius, masterpiece, seminal, potent, tough, gritty and powerful are used solely to prop up the Myth and inflate the Market Value of White Male Artists.



Vanaf het einde van de 18e eeuw nam in Europa het gebruik van gietijzer en klinknagels toe in de 'mechanisering' van het landschap. Bruggen met een roterend mechaniek waren onderdeel van de infrastructuur die bepalend was voor de doorgang via waterweg of spoorlijn. In de film van Richard Serra dient een gietijzeren draaibrug over de Willamette-rivier in Oregon (VS) als 'statief' waarop de camera is bevestigd. Tijdens de rotatie transformeert het statische landschap tot een veranderlijk beeld, waarbij de positie van de brug het zichtveld bepaalt.


In Europe, the use of cast iron and rivets in the "mechanization" of the landscape increased from the end of the 18th century. Bridges with rotating mechanisms were part of the infrastructure that determined passage by waterway or railway. In Richard Serra's film, a cast-iron swing bridge over the Willamette River in Oregon (USA), serves as a "tripod" to which the camera is attached. While it rotates, the static landscape is transformed into a changing image, with the position of the bridge determining the field of view.



The New York Times Oct 19, 2023 Van Gogh Museum Pulls Pokémon Cards After Frenzy







The Van Gogh Museum in Amsterdam gave out special Pokémon cards to celebrate the museum's 50th anniversary and recognize the link between the Dutch artist and Japan. Then things got nutty. Hordes of Pokémon fans stormed the gift shop at Amsterdam's Van Gogh Museum buying up the entire line of new limited-edition Pokémon merchandise within hours and leaving hundreds of others empty-handed and disappointed. Others played a scavenger hunt for free cards.

As crossover events go, this was bound to be a blockbuster: One of the world's most famous museums teaming up with The Pokémon Company, which made \$11.6 billion in licensed goods last year.




A Danish artist has been ordered to repay a museum after delivering blank canvases



A woman stands in front of a blank canvas hung up at the Kunsten Museum in Aalborg, Denmark, in 2021. Danish artist Jens Haaning sent the museum blank canvasses under the title *Take the Money and Run*

The museum, the Kunsten Museum of Modern Art in Aalborg, had given Haaning a loan about \$76,400. The money was to be used to recreate two earlier works by Haaning that depicted — in actual cold, hard cash affixed to canvas in a frame — the average annual income of a Dane and an Austrian, and the sizable gap between them, reflecting wage differences within the European Union.







Yayoi Kusama to bring Infinity Rooms and more to SFMOMA Infinite Love Oct 14, 2023–Sep 7, 2024





Japanese artist Yayoi Kusama — dubbed "the princess of polka dots" for her famous use of the pattern across sculpture, painting and installation — will be the subject of her first solo Northern California exhibition at the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art,



The 1942 exhibition "First Papers of Surrealism" was overlayed with Marcel **Duchamp's "Sixteen Miles** of String" twine installation, sometimes only cited as "Mile of String". The opening also featured "a group of children who, at **Duchamp's instigation,** bounced balls and played hopscotch" in the installation.

Jeffrey Gibson to Become First Indigenous Artist to Represent US Solo at 60th Venice Biennale April 20 to November 24, 2024
